
MUSIC AT ELBURTON PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have adapted the Charanga Primary Music Curriculum to better suit the needs of our children, aligning it with our pedagogical principles and educational goals.

The importance of strong teacher subject knowledge is key, and teachers understand that in music this is not static, but always developing.


A specialist music teacher offer small group tuition in guitar, keyboard, and ukulele.

Singing is at the core of all our music lessons.

Each session begins with a song.

All children participate in both solo and ensemble performances, cultivating their self-confidence, creativity, and sense of accomplishment.

Children appraise a diverse selection of high-quality music sourced from various traditions.



Additional opportunities to showcase their talents are offered through class assemblies, concerts, and participation in the school choir. These events also extend into the wider community, allowing students to perform and share their musical achievements with a broader audience.

Children will receive the instruction and rehearsal opportunities needed to develop expertise in using their voices and playing instruments, progressing with increasing accuracy, fluency, control, and expression.

Children in Y5 and Y6 will have a music tutor from First Access to deliver lesson in ukulele and quitar.

From Nursery to Year 6, children are introduced to all the interrelated dimensions of music, including pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture, and structure.

By the end of Key Stage 2, All children will learn to play a variety of percussion instruments initially, followed by instruction in recorders and stringed instruments.
