Elburton Sports Awareness Event




Author Workshop - Simon James

Dear Parents / Guardians,

As part of our vision for developing a love of reading here at Elburton, we have provided opportunities for children to attend workshops with authors including James Campbell, Julian Clary, Clare Helen Welsh and Robin Stevens over the past few years.

This term, we have arranged an author workshop with award winning local author and illustrator Simon James on Wednesday 18th March. Simon is extremely experienced in visiting schools and offers engaging workshops for children. When visiting schools, he brings his books to life and combines story-telling with re-creating his illustrations to engage and excite the children.

Some of Simon's most well-loved and well-known books include 'Scruff', 'Dear Greenpeace', 'Rex', 'Sally and the Limpet' and 'The Wild Wood'. Simon's books are available in all the usual bookshops and online but he is going to bring a small selection of them with him on the day so that they can be sold after school in the school hall. He is very happy to sign and dedicate them to your child. Please collect your child after school and take them to the hall to meet Simon if you wish to purchase a book. You will need to bring cash with you as book sales are not being organised by the school. The books will cost either £6.99 or £7.99. The book signing event will run from 3.10 – 3.40pm.

We would like to thank the PTA for arranging this workshop session and for funding the day as it will be a valuable learning experience for all the children and help motivate them as readers. The day will consist of a series of workshops during which all the children will have the opportunity to listen to Simon talk about how he was inspired to become a writer and listen to him tell stories. These workshops will be carefully tailored for each year group so that all the children have fun and benefit from the sessions.

We hope that this opportunity will help foster a love of reading in our school by allowing the children to meet a real author and may even inspire children to become writers themselves!
